GUIDELINES

HOUSE & CLUBROOM RULES

Be advised that the following are guidelines for the House & Clubroom for the Speedway Post 500, INC. These rules are not all-inclusive and can be added to and deleted from as deemed necessary by the elected Executive Committee of Speedway Post 500, INC.

1. The following person(s) shall be admitted to the Clubroom:
 - a) Any individual holding a current membership card (Legionnaire, Sons of the American Legion and/or Auxiliary).
 - b) Respectful guests of the American Legion
 - c) An individual looking to join the American Legion
2. Any person purchasing an alcoholic beverage may be asked at any time to show proof of membership or ID. If said person refuses to present these forms of identification, they will be refused service and asked to leave the property.
3. The hours of operation are at the discretion of the House and Clubroom Committee in conjunction with the Clubroom Manager.
4. No alcoholic beverage will be consumed by anyone under the age of 21 (the legal drinking age in the state of Indiana)
5. Gaming is not allowed by anyone under the age of 18. Gaming or Gambling not licensed by the State of Indiana is prohibited anywhere on Post 500 property.
6. Persons under the legal drinking age, as defined above, are not permitted to sit at the bar.
7. Persons under the age of 18 are not permitted in the clubroom 1 hour after the kitchen closes. (Tues-Thurs. 9PM & Fri.-Sat. 10PM)
8. A service animal accompanied by an individual with a disability shall be permitted access, but must remain under control of its handler.
9. Loud, boisterous or inappropriate language or actions will not be tolerated. Any person(s) involved in any harmful or damaging activities, will be held responsible for their actions.
10. The Clubroom Manager, Bartenders and members of the Executive Committee are responsible for the enforcement of the Clubroom rules. When the Clubroom Manager is not present, the bartender on duty is in charge. Post members may be asked to assist with enforcing these rules.
11. Any action or behavior of a patron that is believed to be inappropriate may be reported to the House and Clubroom Committee.
12. **No one** other than employees and Executive Board members are allowed in the kitchen, server station, walk-ins or behind the bar, unless volunteering for an event or permitted by employee or management.
13. All sales of alcoholic beverages are at the discretion of the bartender. No adult beverage will be served to a visibly intoxicated person.
14. There will be no carry-in or carry-out of any alcoholic beverage. Only alcohol served across our bar will be consumed inside Post 500. Alcohol won as a prize **can not** be opened or consumed inside of Post 500.
15. No private sales will be conducted on site without prior approval from the Clubroom Manager and/or the approval of the House & Clubroom Committee.
16. No petitions, letters or leaflets containing derogatory or slanderous remarks

- will be permitted to be distributed or handed out on Post 500 property.
17. The use of tobacco and/or any kind of electronic vaping are prohibited inside Post 500, as voted upon by the general membership of the American Legion Post 500.

Complaints, Investigations and Appeals

All complaints concerning the Clubroom must be in writing and signed by the complainant and include contact information. These grievances should be delivered in a sealed envelope addressed to the House and Clubroom Committee, here in as referred to as the committee. Once received, concerns will be investigated in a timely manner.

After the committee concludes their investigation, they will render a decision and notify the subjects of the complaint in writing. They will also report their findings and decision if sanctions are justified.

Any person(s) that is subject to a complaint and/or sanctions may appeal the decision to the Post Adjutant within (7) calendar days of notice from the Committee. Once the appeal has been delivered to the Post Adjutant, a hearing will be scheduled in front of the Executive Committee for a final determination of the ruling.

The below list of violations and possible sanctions are a guideline that can be imposed. The sanctions can be decreased or increased at the discretion of the Committee, based on their investigation and evidence presented. For the safety and well-being of all, the Committee reserves the right to take any action and to imposed any sanction they deem necessary.

Examples of possible sanctions

Conduct unbecoming: verbal warning to suspension for life

Possession and/or use of illegal substances: up to life suspension

Fighting or touching in a disrespectful manner: request to leave up to suspension for life

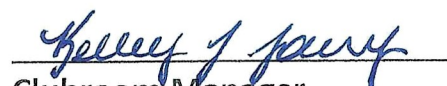
Assault/Brandishing a Weapon: up to life suspension

Theft: up to life suspension
